TRUST IN GOD

Saint Matthew's account of the flight into Egypt takes center stage today as we continue to follow the story of the Holy Family. Once again the angel of the Lord appears to Joseph in a dream, telling him to take the child Jesus and His mother to Egypt. Joseph heeds the command and takes them on what must have been a strenuous journey. Saint Matthew does not give us any of the details, but we can only imagine what this journey must have been like. Where did they eat? Where did they find shelter? What were the roads like? Was Joseph able to find work? The Holy Family survived in no small measure because they put their trust in God. This is exactly what today's feast calls us, God's holy family, to do.

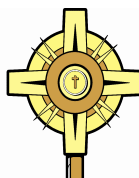
The Golden Compass

JANUARY 1: WORLD DAY OF PEACE 2008 -

In 1968, Pope Paul VI called on all people of the world to together celebrate the "Day of Peace" on January 1. Since 1968, each year, that day has been celebrated by Catholics and non-Catholics alike and is marked by a special annual peace message from the Holy Father.

According to Church teaching, peace is built on a commitment to love and justice, and flourishes when all realize their responsibility for promoting it. True peace can only be attained when the dignity of each human being is respected. The Church is called to be a sacrament and instrument of peace in the world and must work, along with its members, to promote peace and its foundations: love, justice development, and reconciliation.

In this year's message, "The Human Family: Community of Peace," Pope Benedict XVI focuses on the one human family, conceived of by God as a community of peace. Each individual, the Holy Father writes, is called to recognize his or her place in the human family, and to work to bring about a world of peace. The full text of this year's statement is available at www.vatican.va/holy_father/benedict_xvi/messages/peace/index_en.htm. After reading the message, discuss:

- 1) *What does Pope Benedict XVI describe as the responsibilities of the global community?*
- 2) *How might adopting the Holy Father's perspective about the human family change world relations and/or U.S. policies?*
- 3) *How does this message challenge you? How can you personally take up the challenge to bring about a community of peace?*
