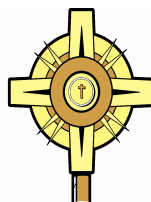

ADORATION, EUCHARISTIC DEVOTION & RECONCILIATION *Pope Benedict XVI, 2007*

In the Eucharist, the Son of God comes to meet us; in Eucharistic adoration we go to meet the Son of God. "Eucharistic adoration is simply the natural consequence of the Eucharistic celebration, which is itself the Church's supreme act of adoration," Pope Benedict explains. He encourages all of us "to make time for personal prayer before the Sacrament of the Altar," as well as other devotions dedicated to Eucharistic Adoration. He reminds us that the "meaning of the Eucharist must include the call to the path of penance," and thus, we need to partake of the Sacrament of Reconciliation as part of the process of conversion.

Participation without Reception:

Participation in the Eucharist is more than receiving Communion. A Catholic is asked to approach the Eucharist only after "an examination of his or her life." If we, for whatever reason, are in a position where reception "objectively contradicts the loving union of Christ and the Church made present in the Eucharist", we are asked to prayerfully and sacrificially refrain from receiving the Body and Blood of Christ. This is the case, for instance, with divorced and remarried Catholics whose first marriages have not been annulled, non-Catholic Christians, and those who are in a serious state of sin. Catholics in public life are also reminded of their grave responsibility to stand up for fundamental values like the defense of human life from conception to natural death, traditional marriage, parental rights in education.

What It All Means:

It is easy for us to say that the Eucharist is the center of our lives; it is a bit harder to actually live it. What holds us back? Is it that we don't fully understand this gift? Has going to Mass become a routine?

Pope Benedict's *Sacrament of Charity* is a gift given as encouragement to open our hearts to this great mystery of the Eucharist - the Real Presence of Jesus, the Son of God. It is a gentle and loving reminder that we can always approach Jesus with an open heart, despite our sinful and often doubting natures.

"The Eucharist, since it embraces the concrete, everyday existence of the believer, makes possible, day by day, the progressive transfiguration of all those called by Grace to reflect the Son of God. There is nothing authentically human - our thoughts and our affections, our words and our deeds - that does not find in the Sacrament of the Eucharist the form it needs to be lived to the full".

Jesus' gift of Himself is not merely an action; it is the source of our lives. "We too cannot live without partaking of the Sacrament of our salvation," Pope Benedict reminds us. The full text of the Apostolic Exhortation is available at www.vatican.va.

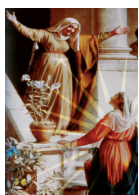

OCTOBER IS RIGHT TO LIFE MONTH

- 4th of a four part series

This week's final theme:

Caring For Your Aging Loved Ones

If you're a family caregiver, we thank you for what you do. It may never have occurred to you that *caregiving is pro-life*. Your compassion, dedication

and hard work are testimonies to the value of human life.

There is a spiritual component to the vocation of caregiving but there is also the nitty-gritty details. We've learned that while every situation is unique, there are common basic issues that need addressing.

Anger - The stress of caregiving can unleash a torrent of unexpected emotions and bring challenges that often have no clear solutions. Look for a support group or good friend where you can "dump" some of that anger. Forgive yourself. Go back and apologize. You can start over.

Guilt - It helps to realize that no matter what you do - no matter how much or how little - you are likely to feel guilty. Remember that you're not perfect. Know that you can set limits. Don't wait for a crisis to arise before getting supplemental help.

Exhaustion - Exhaustion is more than just being tired. It's being tired for weeks, being tired for months. Don't deny the problem. Admit that being exhausted isn't good for you personally, or for you as a caregiver. Give yourself a tiny break. For a minute or two, go into the bathroom. Shut the door and wash your face with cool water. Taking a day off may be impossible. But, you can take a one minute break. Get help. Ask family members to assist. Look into respite care. Even a few hours once a week can help a lot.

Respite Care - "Respite Care" means a break for someone who is taking care of an ill person, a rest for the person primarily

responsible for the well being of another.

A primary caregiver needs to take breaks or soon will burn out. Admit that caregiving is a complicated experience. Remember that the break is for you. Don't fill the time running errands for the person in your care, going grocery shopping, getting the car fixed, and so on.

To find someone to help you with respite care, check with a local social service agency, ask at the parish or contact a local program. Ask for help from family members, fellow parishioners, friends, neighbors and the community. Many people would like to help but don't know what you need. Let them know specifically what they can do to help.

Spirituality - God has chosen you to play a central role in providing the care needed. Just as from the cross Jesus asked St. John - the patron saint of caregivers - to take care of His Blessed Mother, God asks you to help take care of someone else He deeply loves. *What you're doing is a prayer, and the path that you and your loved one are taking is a pilgrimage.* It is the Father asking you to help His son or daughter along these final stages of that journey. It is the Son who has told us whatever we do for those in need we do for Him. And, it is the Spirit who is with you right now. God the Father, Son and the Holy Spirit will richly bless you and you loved one in this life, and in the life to come. (For more info on caregiving go to: www.fsjc.org)

FEDERAL ACTION ALERT From the Diocese of Florida and the Florida Catholic Conference

Issue: The Mexico City Policy (MCP) provides that no U.S. population assistance funds can be given to a nongovernmental organization unless it certifies that it will not perform or actively promote abortion as a method of family planning. Earlier this year, both the U.S. House of Representatives and the U.S. Senate approved amendments to negate the MCP. These amendments were attached to the Fiscal Year 2008 State Department/Foreign Operations Bill (H.R. 2764). That bill passed both the House and Senate and awaits action by conference committee to resolve bill differences.

Action: Please contact your U.S. Representative and U.S. Senators Martinez and Nelson by e-mail or telephone as soon as possible and urge them to uphold the Mexico City Policy. MINISTRY OF THE SICK

When being admitted to the hospital, it is imperative that you give the name of your parish, state that you are Catholic and WISH TO BE SEEN BY A PRIEST, otherwise you might not be visited.

If you go through the emergency room, 99% of the time your name and parish will not get on the Catholic list. Please be sure that the admissions office is notified.

The following hospitals are the responsibility of the parish in which they are located.

- Lee Memorial Hospital - visited daily by St. Francis Xavier Parish, 334-2161

A priest is on call 7 days a week, 24 hours a day for the above hospitals at the above telephone numbers.
