## DEPENDING ON GOD

"Getting by with a little help from our friends" is not an idea that began with the Beatles. Certainly the idea of "getting by with a little help from God" goes back at least to the first reading today from Exodus. How we get that help, however, is the key to this weekend's scriptures.

No matter how inadequate Moses felt to the task God had given him, he persevered—even though he needed help from the people around him. The Israelites especially depended on God for freedom. The woman in the Gospel, desperate and destitute, had no one to depend on, but still she would not give up. She could not afford to bribe the unscrupulous judge, but she pestered him into weariness until finally he met her demands.

We sometimes need to turn to others to help us through difficult times; but if we always turn to God, we won't be disappointed, for our help, the psalm assures us, is from the Lord.

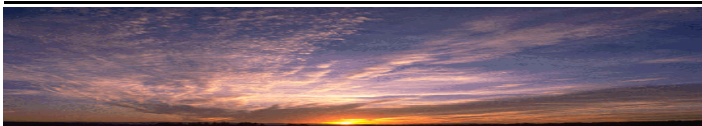

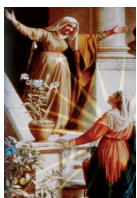

**OCTOBER IS RIGHT TO LIFE MONTH - 3rd of 4 part series**  
**This weeks theme:**

***Embryo and Adult Stem Cell Research***

The American College of Pediatricians (ACP) called for state and federal funding of adult stem cell research, saying that throwing money at embryo stem cell research is a waste and loss to those who need the treatment.

Dr. Michelle Cretella, spokeswoman for ACP said, "not only does embryonic research require taking the life of human embryos, it also prolongs needless suffering by delaying the development of more promising adult stem cell treatment and cures. They have yielded impressive results. Certain forms of cancer therapy now routinely use adult stem cells. While adult stem cells have been successfully used to treat spinal cord injury, heart failure, Parkinson's Disease, diabetes and dozens of other conditions in human trials, this has not been the case with any embryonic stem cell trial. Instead, there have been catastrophic results with these cells producing the wrong tissue, forming tumors and triggering immune rejection.

"Every dollar spent on the failed and unnecessary process of embryonic stem cell research steals resources away from the established utility and potential of adult stem cell research. This is fiscally irresponsible and medically unconscionable."

Scientists in Brazil found that adult stem cell treatments helped 14 or 15 diabetes patients become insulin free. D. Richard Burt from Northwestern University's Feingold School of Medicine in Chicago, who worked with the scientists, exclaimed, **"It's the first time in the history of Type I diabetes where people have gone with no treatment whatsoever... no medications at all, with normal blood sugars."** This is great news for the millions of Americans who suffer from diabetes. However, the American Diabetes Assc. and the Juvenile Diabetes Research Foundation "were not interested" in funding this research. Instead they have spent large amounts lobbying Congress to fund embryonic stem cell research.

A priest is on call 7 days a week, 24 hours a day for the above hospitals at the above telephone numbers.

Parishioners at Hospitals and Nursing Homes (within our parish boundaries) are visited by Resurrection priests as follows:

- All Hospitals: Monday, Wednesday, Friday
  - Nursing Homes & Shut-ins: Tuesday, Thursday, Saturday
