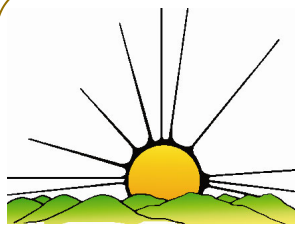

You will be checked for the following: Pulse rate, blood pressure, body temperature, hemoglobin (iron level), blood type, cholesterol level.

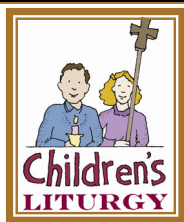

RESURRECTION CHILDREN'S LITURGY: ALL ARE WELCOME!

Each Sunday at 9:30a.m., all children who are present are invited to participate in our Children's Liturgy. The front pews are reserved for any child who wishes to sit with us. We meet in the main vestibule before Mass and process to the front pews.

Volunteers are taken to carry the Crucifix at the start and end of Mass, as well as for carrying the gifts for the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

Sitting in the front of the church provides children with a better view of what is happening and, consequently, they behave better than when they cannot see the priest.

After the Gospel, all children are encouraged to come forward and sit on the steps for the Homily. The priest will dismiss them when the Homily is finished.

Children are again invited to the Sanctuary for the Lord's Prayer and reception of the Eucharist. Younger children who have not yet received their First Eucharist can fold their arms across their chest for a blessing. Children return to their seats for the conclusion of Mass.

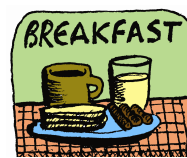

**40 DAYS FOR LIFE
IN SW FLORIDA**

Our parish is invited to join with other Catholic churches and individuals in a **national campaign of prayer and fasting** for the end of abortion called the *40 Days for Life*. (See 40days-forlife.com). The event will be held outside the Planned Parenthood abortion facility in Sarasota for 40 days, **Sept. 26 thru Nov. 4**, 8:00a.m-8:00p.m. This is what we can do when in our country 3,600 babies per day are being destroyed in the womb of their mothers. This is what we can do in the face of **Planned Parenthood, the Goliath of the abortion industry** with its immense budget, a third of which (\$305 million) was provided through tax payer funding in the last year.
